## STANDING RULES OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES 1 2 3 **Standing Rule No. 1** 4 **Order of Business, Annual Meeting** 5 (Revised October 21, 1983; Editorially Revised October 27, 1995) 6 7 The order of business, as published in the Official Reports Book, shall be the official order of business for 8 all sessions of the House of Delegates. This may be revised by the Speaker to expedite the business of 9 the House, subject to any objection sustained by the House. 10 11 Standing Rule No. 2 12 **Procedure for Submitting Resolutions** 13 (Revised Nov. 6, 1981; Oct. 23, 1987; October 19, 1990; October 23, 1992; 14 October 27, 200l; October 19, 2002; October 16, 2005; and October 23, 2010; 15 **Editorially Revised October 27, 1995)** 16 17 Resolutions may be submitted at any time prior to thirty (30) days before a meeting of the House of 18 Delegates to become the business of the House. Resolutions received after that date will be posted on 19 the website prior to the meeting to the extent feasible. Those resolutions submitted later than 30 days 20 prior to a meeting shall be posted on the website, but to become the business of the House shall require 21 a two-thirds favorable vote of the House members present and voting at the first session. Resolutions 22 requiring a vote of the House are to be accompanied by an explanation for lateness. Such resolutions 23 will be reviewed by the Committee on Rules and Credentials, which will recommend to the House 24 whether they should be accepted or rejected as House business. Authors may be present at the 25 Committee on Rules and Credentials meeting to explain their resolution. The foregoing rule shall not 26 apply to substitute resolutions. Any resolution submitted after the Committee on Rules and Credentials 27 has adjourned will require a three-fourths favorable vote of the members of the House present and 28 voting to become the business of the House. 29 30 All resolutions must be introduced by a member of the House of Delegates either acting as an individual 31 or as a representative for a component society, specialty, or section. 32 33 Resolutions emanating from a business meeting of an officially-recognized section of the Pennsylvania 34 Medical Society may be presented for consideration by the House of Delegates at any time before the 35 close of business at the opening session of the House. Discretion is urged in the number and timeliness 36 of the subjects of the resolutions introduced. 37 38 Resolutions emanating from, and approved by, the Board of Trustees may be submitted directly to the 39 House of Delegates at any time prior to or during the meeting at the discretion of the Speaker. 40 41 All resolutions are to be submitted to the Secretary of this Society and are to include the names of the 42 author and the introducer. 43 44 The Speaker of the House of Delegates, during the meeting of the House, shall have the right to declare 45 any resolution out of order in accordance with the principles of the parliamentary authority designated 46 in the bylaws. 47

19	Voting Procedures of the House
20	(Revised October 23, 1972; & October 19, 1990; October 19, 2002;
21	Editorially Revised Nov. 6, 1981 & October 27, 1995)
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23	To expedite the work of the House, voting will be held during a recess of the House at a time or times
24	designated by the Speaker. Each delegate seated as of and including the second session of the House
25	will, during such recess, be certified by a member of the Committee on Rules and Credentials as a
26	delegate at a location which will be announced by the Speaker. At that time, the delegate will vote. The
27	opening and closing times of the polls will be announced by the Speaker.

30	Procedure Regarding the Report of the Committee to Nominate
31	Delegates and Alternates to the AMA and Elections of

37	delegates in their Official Reports Book material at the opening session. Nominating speeches may only
38	be one minute in length for any nominee who does not speak at the Luncheon to Meet the AMA
39	Delegate and Alternate Delegate Candidates. There will be no seconding speeches. All names on the
40	ballot shall be listed alphabetically with an asterisk denoting those being nominated by the nominating

46 47	The 1001 House of Delegates following on ones bearing of the Defending Committee on Dules and
47 40	The 1991 House of Delegates, following an open hearing of the Reference Committee on Rules and
48 40	Credentials, approved the recommendation that the bullet ballot will, henceforth, be discontinued. It is
49 50	required that if there are multiple candidates for positions of equal rank, a vote for every position must
JU	be cast. Failure to vote for all positions will invalidate the ballot.

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6	The Speaker shall not recognize the motion to vote immediately or terminate debate as being "in order"
7	unless both sides of a pending item of business have been heard.
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9	Standing Rule No. 9
10	Election Rules for Offices Requiring a Majority Vote
11	(Adopted October 22, 1982; Editorially Revised October 27, 1995)
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13	When a majority vote is not obtained by any one candidate on the first ballot, the names of the two
14	candidates receiving the most votes will remain on the ballot for the second vote if their combined total
15	is 50 percent of those voting. If the first two candidates do not have at least 50 percent of the votes, the
16	candidate who received the third-highest vote will be added to the ballot.
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18	Standing Rule No. 10
19	Procedures for Nominating Delegates and Alternate Delegates to the AMA
20	(Adopted October 22, 1982; Revised October 21, 1994, and October 27, 2001;
21	Editorially Revised October 17, 1995; Amended October 20, 2007)
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23	The election of delegates and alternate delegates to the AMA shall allow a delegate who is defeated to
24	be a candidate for an alternate delegate seat, and an alternate who is defeated as a candidate for
25	delegate to be a candidate for an alternate delegate seat. To accomplish this, the election of delegates
26	will take place before the second session of the House. Alternate delegates who have not completed
27	year one of their two-year term and who wish to run for delegate must resign from their unexpired term
28	as alternate delegate. Election of alternate delegates will also occur before the final scheduled session
29	of the House.

32	Number of Delegates to Serve as Sergeants-at-Arms

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36	The Speaker shall appoint a sufficient number of delegates to act as Sergeants-at-Arms to maintain
37	security. The Sergeants-at-Arms shall also serve as the Tellers.

40	<u>Time Limits on Debate from the Floor of the House</u>

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43	There shall be a three-minute limit on debate per speaker from the House Floor.
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1 **Standing Rule No. 13** 2 **Disclosure of Financial Interests by Delegates** 3 (Adopted October 18, 1996) 4 5 Members of the House of Delegates who have a substantial financial interest in a commercial 6 enterprise, which interest will be materially affected by a matter before the House of Delegates, must 7 publicly disclose that interest before: 8 9 -testifying at a reference committee on the matter, or 10 -speaking on the floor of the House of Delegates on the matter. 11 12 **Standing Rule No. 14** 13 **Procedures for Amendments** 14 (Adopted October 18, 1996) 15 16 All amendments five words or more in length must be handed to the Speaker in writing; however, it is 17 preferred that the amendment be taken to the Control Desk to be typed. This should be done in 18 advance of the amendment being proposed from the floor, when possible. To the extent feasible, 19 amendments five words or more will be made available to the House either on paper or electronically. 20 21 **Standing Rule No. 15** 22 Reference Committee Reports – Consent Calendar 23 (Adopted October 17, 1997) 24 25 The Speaker shall have the option to present reference committee reports as a consent calendar. 26 27 **Standing Rule No. 16** Electronic Device Use and Rules for Distribution of Materials/Information at the House Meeting 28 29 (Adopted October 13, 2000) 30 31 The business of the House and its reference committees shall not be interrupted by the use of electronic 32 devices or the distribution of any materials or information unapproved by the Speaker during the 33 conduct of its business. All pagers, cellular telephones, and other electronic devices must be placed in 34 silent mode (e.g., vibrate or inactivated). 35 36 **Standing Rule No. 17** 37 Referral of Items of Business to the Board 38 (Adopted October 21, 2006) 39 40 Two subsidiary motions to refer items of business from the House of Delegates to the Board of Trustees shall be in order. A motion to "Refer for Study" shall outrank a motion to amend, and a motion to 41 42 "Refer for Decision" shall outrank the motion to amend and the motion to refer for study. These 43 motions require a second; are debatable; are amendable; and require a majority vote for adoption. The 44 maker of these motions may not interrupt one who has the floor. 45 46 47 48 49 50
