10	recommended immunization practices to improve the health of all Pennsylvanians.
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12	Background
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14	The author is concerned that only approximately half of all counties in Pennsylvania have local
15	immunization coalitions to increase awareness and utilization of available immunizations across the state.
16	The Pennsylvania Immunization Coalition serves as an overarching organization to coordinate, promote
17	and advocate for immunization education and increased administration across the state. It is believed that
18	any incremental increase in immunizations will lead to a significant decrease in healthcare expenses
19 20	required for caring for patients who acquire vaccine preventable diseases.
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21 22	Discussion
22 23	Contact was made with the Immunization Director at the Depressivenic Department of Health (DOH) to
23 24	Contact was made with the Immunization Director at the Pennsylvania Department of Health (DOH) to ascertain the status of the Pennsylvania Immunization Coalition (PAIC). According to DOH, they were
24 25	working with the PAIC Executive Board to keep PAIC active. Effective April 2017, DOH will be providing
25 26	annual funding to PAIC and an Independent Administrator will work with the Executive Board and serve
20 27	as the point of contact for local and regional coalitions.
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29	RECOMMENDATION
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31	1. Since the Department of Health is providing annual funding to the Pennsylvania Immunization
32	Coalition, the Board of Trustees recommends that staff continue to monitor the status of the
33	Coalition.

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
