

Oral Health in Your Office & Oral Health in the Prenatal Office

The **EPIC** (Educating Practices/Physicians in their Communities) – **Oral Health in Your Office** and **Oral Health in the Prenatal Office** are statewide educational programs using office-based change as the key to promoting preventive oral health for children and pregnant women. Delivered in the medical office, these **FREE**, one-hour presentations are conducted by peer professionals (including physicians, nurses, dentists and hygienists) on-site at your location to your entire office staff and offer one CME/CEU credit for participants.

The Oral Health in Your Office training:

- provides information on integrating oral health screening, risk assessment and fluoride varnish application into pediatric well visits
- provides support around reimbursement for fluoride varnish application for children under 5 now covered by both private and Medicaid insurers
- o enables physicians to become eligible to receive Medicaid reimbursement
- o provides educational materials and fluoride varnish samples

The Oral Health in the Prenatal Office training:

- o focuses on promoting good oral health practices for pregnant women.
- provides information on the importance of good oral health to overall health especially during pregnancy, strategies to encourage pregnant patients to visit the dentist and basic dental disease etiology and prevention
- o provides educational materials and supplies
