WHEREAS, Paul C. Brucker, MD, President emeritus of Thomas Jefferson University, passed away March 23, 2017 at Thomas Jefferson University Hospital in Philadelphia at the age of 85; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Brucker received his medical degree from the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine; completed a residency in General Practice; designed his own graduate training program which included a residency at Hunterdon Medical Center, NJ and an internship at the Lankenau Hospital; practiced family medicine in the community of Ambler, PA and served as preceptor and role model for numerous students from various medical schools; and

WHEREAS, in 1973, Jefferson Medical College hired Dr. Brucker as a Professor and founding Chair of their Department of Family Medicine where, under his tenure, Jefferson gained national renown as one of the most successful student and residency training programs in family medicine in the country and led Thomas Jefferson University and its hospital to financial and research grant success as well as providing institutional leadership which resulted in the formation of the Jefferson Health System, where he served as Board Chair; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Brucker helped to establish fellowship programs in faculty development and geriatrics, serving as Chair of the medical school's Curriculum Committee and the Committee on Student Promotion; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Brucker had a major influence on the training of physicians across the country, especially in emphasizing the importance of primary care doctors; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Brucker was an active member of the Philadelphia County Medical Society (PCMS) and the Pennsylvania Medical Society (PAMED) for 57 years; a Fellow and past President of the College of Physicians of Philadelphia; a member of the Board of Directors of the American Board of Family Practice, having also served as President; elected to the prestigious Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Brucker was the recipient of many accolades and awards including the creation of the Paul C. Brucker, MD Annual Lecture in his honor at Jefferson; and the Strittmatter Award from the Philadelphia County Medical Society; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Brucker was devoted to his wife, Joan Waite Brucker, for 59 years and together raised 3 accomplished children: Sheryl Kelly, Linda Vozzo, and Paul C. Brucker, Jr.; and seven grandchildren; therefore, be it
