PMSA Emergency Assistance Fund Update

The PMSA Emergency Assistance Fund was created by the Pennsylvania Medical Society Alliance at a post board meeting in October of 1989, in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. At that time there was a call for assistance for victims of Hurricane Hugo, which destroyed many parts of South Carolina in the fall of that year. In the same timeline, San Francisco suffered a devastating earthquake. The first two grants were sent to these states. The money from this fund helps physician practices to rebuild and replenish medical supplies, as well as food, water and shelter in disaster areas. The money is typically sent to the County Alliances in those locations.

In order to qualify for funds, an occurrence must be declared a federal disaster. **Since 1989, our State Alliance has made 77 donations to 31 State Alliances across the country, totaling \$51,700.** Eight of those awards went to Pennsylvania counties. As of November 12, 2015, there was a balance of \$8,042.18 in the account.

Alliance President, Caryl Schmitz, is initiating an online fundraising project with **Silpada Jewelry**. All proceeds from this online sale will go directly into the Emergency Assistance Fund. The fundraiser will run from **November 13 through December 11 at 11:00 p.m**. To view the beautiful jewelry available through Silpada and to place an order, please go to **http://sild.es/11u9**. Essie Petrovich, our Silpada consultant, will donate 25% of all proceeds from this sale to the Emergency Assistance Fund. Adams County Medical Society Alliance

In order to support community health initiatives throughout our county both now and in the future, in 2012 the Adams County Medical Society Alliance established the Adams County Medical Society/Alliance Fund under the umbrella of the Adams County Community Foundation.

To help build our fund balance, in 2014 we held a well-attended wine-tasting fundraiser that was so popular, we knew we had to plan similar events in the future—so this year we held a fun and educational Oktoberfest beer-tasting event in the home of one of our members.

We invited a physician-spouse and a local physical therapist, both home brewers, to lead the evening's tasting. These beer enthusiasts chose and generously provided the beer for the event. They offered brewing and tasting notes for each of the beers we sampled—everything from lager to pumpkin beer to coffee stout. We accompanied each tasting sample with an appetizer we chose to complement the flavors of that beer—all appetizers were donated by our members.

The event was well-attended, and we raised more than \$1,000 for our fund! But perhaps most importantly, we enjoyed getting to know members of the county's medical community, some of whom were new to town, while building excitement about our fund and our county organization. We're already planning future tasting events such as a bourbon tasting and/or a chocolate tasting!

The Lawrence County Medical Society Auxiliary (LCMSA) was awarded the *Fundraiser of the Year Award* by the Pennsylvania Medical Society Alliance for their annual pecan and nut sale. Every fall, the group dons their aprons and gloves to sugar and spice fresh pecans harvested from Georgia. Once they are baked, they are cooled and packed into festive topped jars and sold to the public in the lobby of Jameson Hospital along with bags of whole pecans, cashews, walnuts and almonds both whole and slivered. The nut sale is publicized in the local paper and always gets a great response from the community.

Their fundraiser has been successful for over 40 years with the proceeds benefitting community service providers such as, the Children's Advocacy Nurse-Family Partnership of Lawrence County.

A check in the amount of \$300 was presented to current LCMSA President, Theresa Kaul and Pamela Stoner, Second Vice-President of LCMSA at the state Annual Business Meeting on October 25, 2015. "It was a great honor" stated Kaul "there's a long legacy to this fundraiser and knowing you are doing something positive for your community and at the same time giving a great quality product that people enjoy and look forward to is a great feeling."

The PMSA is pleased to host the American Medical Association Alliance's Northeast Regional Meeting from April 15-17.
