

History of Health Care Preparedness

- 2 kickoff moments
 - 9/11/2001 & Amerithrax focused nation's efforts on disaster preparedness to a degree not seen before
 - Hurricane Katrina emphasized need for improved local, state and federal coordination
- Other paradigm shifters
 - 2009 H1N1




History of Health Care Preparedness

- Federal timeline
 - Pre 9/11 Individual entities who may or may not have any level of preparedness
 - 2002 National Bioterrorism Hospital Preparedness Program launched
 - 2006 Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response (ASPR) established in HHS
 - 2011 Healthcare Preparedness Capabilities Released
 - 2017 Revised Healthcare Preparedness Capabilities



History of Health Care Preparedness

Evolving focus of the federal grant programs





- Creation of ASPR formalized various components of health system preparedness at federal level
 - Office of Emergency Management (OEM) holds operational components, including:
 - Division of Operations/Secretary's Operations Center
 - National Healthcare Preparedness Program
 - Critical Infrastructure Preparedness Program
 - National Disaster Medical System (NDMS)
 - Other ASPR offices oversee various aspects (policy, finance, etc.)








- ASPR/OEM Division of Operations
 - Oversees and coordinates federal response
 - US Public Health Service Commissioned Corps members
 - Other areas of HHS during emergency response
 - SOC coordinating health and medical response to Harvey, Irma, Maria





- ASPR/OEM National Health System Preparedness Program
 - Oversees cooperative agreements with states/territories/DFCs
 - Responsible for preparedness capabilities
 - Funding stream for state and local preparedness efforts






- ASPR/OEM Critical Infrastructure Protection Program
 - Health care facilities are a recognized "critical infrastructure" in communities
 - Program works on public-private partnerships to better ensure health care community is integrated into critical infrastructure needs
 - Utilities
 - Cyber threats
 - Other system failures




- ASPR/OEM National Disaster Medical System
 - Coordination Component national patient movement system
 - Response Component assets for field response during a disaster
 - Disaster Medical Assistance Teams (DMAT)
 - Disaster Mortuary Assistance Teams (DMORT)
 - National Veterinary Response Teams (NVRT)
 - Specialized teams











- PADOH as primary awardee
 - Contractual arrangement with HHS/CDC
 - Receive funding in order to meet specific work objectives
 - Fulfillment of Capabilities
 - Performance measures
 - Regional/Local preparedness efforts healthcare coalitions
 - Emergency System for Advanced Registry of Volunteer Health Professionals (ESAR-VHP)



Figure 1: Crosswalk of the 2012 and 2017-2022 Capabilities









- Health Care Coalitions (HCCs)
 - Primary focus of federal and state initiatives for health care preparedness
 - Built on a collaborative model bringing all providers within a geographic region together for planning, training/exercising and response coordination
 - Built on four core partners (required) and multiple other organization types
 - 9 HCCs in Pennsylvania












- Activities of the HCC
 - Regional planning
 - Training initiatives
 - Exercising (testing of plans)
 - Regional coordination (operationalization)
- Facilitated through arrangement between PADOH and the Hospital and Healthsystem Association of Pennsylvania (HAP)
- Starting July 1, 2017 funding





- Deployable Assets
 - State Medical Assistance Teams (SMATs)
 - Deployable teams with personnel and resources
 - Multi-role (facility support, medical surge, special events)





- Deployable Assets
 - Mobile Medical Surge Systems (MMSS) and Casualty Collection Points (CCP)
 - Deployable tent systems with limited supplies
 - Can be used as temporary shelters, or locations in which a team can carry out short term/low acuity care (triage, treatment of walking wounded, etc.)
 - Medical Supply/Equipment Cache (MSEC)
 - Clinical supplies and cots to be used in a fixed facility
 - Intended for short term/low acuity care
 - Both require staffing complement



- Deployable Assets
 - Emergency Medical Services Strike Teams
 - Teams in increments of five ambulances
 - Typically with personnel and supplies to run 24 hour operations for up to two weeks
 - Often have tents/resources for crew rest





- ESAR-VHP Program
 - State Emergency Registry of Volunteers in Pennsylvania (SERV-PA)
 - Statewide database of medical volunteers
 - Automatically verifies credential levels
 - Must be part of an organization within the system
 - https://serv.pa.gov





- Medical Reserve Corps
 - National project to train teams of medical and non-medical volunteers in local medica communities
 - PA has ten local teams across the commonwealth – always looking for more!
 - Most utilize SERV-PA system for managing volunteers

- Individual preparedness
 - Do YOU have an emergency plan?
 - Do your patients have emergency plans?
 - Creating a culture of preparedness leads to resilient communities
 - Know what to do during a disaster
 - Have a communications plan
 - Have an emergency kit supplies, food, water for 72 hours
 - <u>www.ready.pa.gov</u> for resources



- System/practice preparedness
 - 50-60% of Primary Care offices say they don't have a plan for either medical emergencies or natural disasters¹
 - Supply chain does your practice have supplies/materials on hand in case of a disruption in the medical supply chain?



- Local/regional volunteer programs
 - Medical Reserve Corps
 - Philadelphia, Delaware, Chester, Montgomery, Bucks, Lancaster, Allegheny and Erie Counties; Allentown and Bethlehem Cities
 - Many will accept volunteers from nearby areas
 - Visit mrc.hhs.gov to search for MRC unit contact information
